PASTOR NOTE

Embraced by Hope Memorial Mass: On Monday Oct. 16th at 6:00 PM, Mass will be offered for our children who have gone before us in death, to pray with those families who have suffered the cross of infertility, to pray for those desiring to conceive or adopt, and to pray for those mothers/families who are pregnant and for their child whom they await. At this Mass all of the Roses with their remembrances and prayer requests will be placed near the sanctuary so that our children will be remembered, and prayers offered. At this Mass Msgr. Kruse will bless the Embraced by Hope Crosses. Msgr. Kruse will invite those who have suffered the loss of a child, those who have carried or are carrying the cross of infertility, those grandparents who have lost a grandchild, and those who are expecting a baby, to come forward at that time to receive an Embraced by Hope Cross. The crosses will be given out in silence and without expressing the exact reason for one receiving a cross. If preferring greater privacy, one may receive a cross by picking one up after Mass or requesting one from Msgr. Kruse or Susanna Prushinski. If you are unable to attend Mass on Monday Oct. 16th, but would like to receive your memorial cross, please contact us and we will make sure you receive one. We invite everyone to attend this Mass. May our prayers be joined together, placed in the hands of our Blessed Mother and then be offered to Jesus.

Growing Disciples Diocesan Program: Recently, Bishop Tylka announced the Second Round Parish Model involving St. Louis parish. This proposal is a merging of the following four parishes into one parish: St. Louis, Princeton, St. John, Walnut; Immaculate Conception, Ohio; and St. Mary, Tiskilwa. The proposal designates St. Louis church as the primary site of worship. St. John church will be a secondary site of worship. The churches of Immaculate Conception and St. Mary are proposed to be closed. At this time, we have the opportunity to submit feedback to the Bishop regarding this proposal. Then complete the form. The period for offering Feedback will end on Nov. 23, 2023.

Priest Assembly Days: Each year at this time, the priests of the Diocese meet for a two-day workshop. We will meet on Tuesday and Wednesday. I have adjusted the Mass times in order to accommodate attending this workshop while also serving the parish. This year we will hear some presentations by a priest from out East who implemented a multi-parish merger. We will also continue discussions about Growing Disciples. I kindly ask for your prayers for the priests of the Diocese as we gather for our annual workshop.

The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from The Spiritual Life by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

Exterior Means of Perfection.

There are four principal exterior means of perfection. They include: spiritual direction, rule of life, spiritual reading and sanctification of our social relations.

Spiritual direction is the act of regularly engaging with another experienced person who assists us on our spiritual journey. We need a spiritual physician to make a sound diagnosis of our state of soul and to prescribe the most effective remedies. Perfection is achieved through the advice of a spiritual director.

A rule of life extends spiritual direction by imparting to the person principles and rules that will enable the person to sanctify all his acts through obedience and that will provide him a norm of conduct at once sound and safe. A rule of life makes good use of our time, super naturalizes our acts and follows a program of perfection.

Spiritual reading includes reading Scripture, writings of saints and other spiritual texts. Spiritual reading sustains in us the spirit of prayer. It extends our conversation with God.

Sanctifying of our social relationships primarily involves our relations with other people. Since the Fall of Man, our social relationships can be a cause of turning ourselves away from God. Relationships can be a cause of sin and prevent spiritual perfection. We must learn to use relationships as a means to reach God. Our relationships must be super naturalized – made holy.

Art Buchwald, the longtime humorist for the Washington Post who died in 2007 is credited with saying, "The best things in life aren't things." As Christians, we know this statement to be true. Certainly the best things in our lives are not those items that money can buy or things we can create in the material world. Faith, hope, and love are more precious than anything we can see with our eyes. Yet, as humans we often find ourselves longing for the very things that we claim are not nearly as valuable. We lose sight of what is real and true.

Paul wrote in the fourth chapter of his Letter to the Philippians that he has experienced both living with abundance and then with very little. Regardless of what we have in terms of worldly goods, Paul reminds us that God provides for all our needs. God may not provide for our wants, but he does give us what we need.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored. But there's gold in them thar hills, if we have courage to look. This week Jesus gives us a terrifying warning in his parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.

Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life matters. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There is a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our 'yes' be?
