PASTOR NOTE

All Saints Day: Nov. 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints Day and it is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be offered as a Vigil on Oct. 31st at 5:15pm. On Nov. 1st, Mass will be offered 7am and 5:15pm. On this feast we celebrate all of the saints in heaven, especially those who are not formally canonized and on the regular saint calendar. These may include many of your relatives and friends!

<u>All Souls Day:</u> Nov. 2nd is the feast of All Souls day where the Church prays for all of those who died. We pray for those who may need to be purified and enter the eternal joy of heaven. These may include many of your relatives and friends. Please join us for Mass at 7am.

Mass Intentions: You may recall that last year, I changed the process for scheduling Mass Intentions for the parish. This change has accommodated Masses to be offered for a recently deceased loved one in a more timely way. In the past, a Mass could not be scheduled for well over a year after loved one's death. According to our new process, an individual may schedule two Masses at one time. Beginning in November, individuals may contact the Parish Office and schedule two Masses for the 2023 calendar. These two Masses may be taken from previously requested Masses on file at the Office or may be new requests.

Altar Server Training: The youth of the parish are invited to become an Altar Server at Mass. Any youth, boy or girl, from Fourth Grade and up are invited to be an Altar Server. Training will take place on Saturday, Nov. 12th, 10am at the Church. It will last about an hour. One parent is requested to be present and must complete a registration form. Generally, youth serve twice a month and we will do our best to accommodate the Mass time requested. For special cases, alternative training may be possible. Please contact the Office.

Annual Diocesan Appeal: A few months ago, we began our support of the Annual Diocesan Appeal, which helps with so many ministerial efforts in the Diocese. Many parishioners have participated in this appeal. We are getting closer and closer to meeting our parish goal. Thank you for your generous donation. Very soon, Bishop Lou will be sending a follow up letter to those who have not yet made a donation. I encourage you to participate in the Diocesan Appeal. NOURISHED IN SPIRIT

Freedom of power is also necessary for a couple to freely enter marriage. Both the man and woman must have mature powers of being able to make a free choice. They must have sufficient maturity and nothing can be inhibiting their freedom of choosing. Throughout the marriage preparation process, the priest is constantly assessing the couple's maturity. Again, an extreme example can offer clarity: Imagine that Billy is quite selfish as seen by his constant drunkenness, inability to hold a job and huge debt. And, Tammy has never dated and is absolutely star-struck by Billy's tattoos, muscles and motorcycle. She loves getting away from her abusive family and spending time with Billy – even though he's drunk. Their maturity is questionable and could inhibit their abilities to freely enter marriage. Another classic example is the "shotgun" wedding where the man marries out of fear for his life. Both the man and woman must have sufficient powers of freedom in order to get married. If these are seriously lacking, then the couple cannot validly marry.

In a similar way, the couple must have freedom of capacity. Because it is a human person who is choosing marriage, one's very self must be sufficiently able to marry. They must have the right personal capacity in themselves to get married. All of us know that a couple must be of a certain age, not be in close blood relation (you can't marry your sister!), and must be able to consummate the marriage. Likewise, you cannot be in religious vows (priest or nun). And, you cannot presently be in a bond of marriage – previously married, but no annulment; or your previous spouse is still alive. (Oh yea, you cannot kill off your lover's ex-spouse so that you can get married. This is called the impediment of crime.) Also, Catholics must marry according to the rite and ritual of the Catholic Church. This is required because marriage is closely connected to baptism and the Church. Violating any of these impede's one from freely entering marriage. Of course, all of this requires pages to explain, but the point is simple: the person cannot have something in themselves that impedes their freedom. They must have sufficient freedom of capacity.

The person's personal freedom is absolutely necessary for entering marriage. Personal freedom requires the simultaneous sufficiency of freedom of knowledge, freedom of power and freedom of capacity. Only when these are present can the couple truly enter marriage. If there is something impeding their freedom, than there is not a full and free exchange of love. At the heart of marriage is freedom. Not only is this due to the couples free exchange of love; but even more so, it is because of God's free gift of love offered to them in the sacrament of marriage. But, this is for our next newsletter.


2022 Annual Diocesan Appeal Follow Up
