Oath of Fidelity: Whenever a priest takes on a new assignment as Pastor, the Church requires that he make a public Profession of Faith and offer the Oath of Fidelity. This is an opportunity for the new pastor to give public witness to the tenets of the faith as well as express his unity with the magisterium and authority of the Church. Next Saturday, July 3rd, I will offer this public witness before Bishop Jenky's representative, Fr. Gary Blake, who serves as the Vicar Forane of the Illinois Valley. The Vicar Forane is a local pastor who helps assist with diocesan administration in a local area. I will renew my Profession of Faith and Oath of Fidelity at the other parish Masses. I hope that this public witness will be seen as my commitment to serving the people of St. Louis Parish. By the way, the ritual takes only a few minutes!

New Church Air Conditioner Units: I am happy to report that this week new air conditioner units were installed in the Church. The others have served well for a few decades and the new ones will serve us for many years to come.

Nourished in Spirit: Some years ago, I wrote and published a bi-weekly spiritual newsletter called *Nourished in Spirit*. Excerpts from this newsletter will be printed in the weekly bulletin. It seeks to help "average Joe" Catholics grow in their personal spiritual life by offering practical and down to earth advice. It draws from the Scriptures, writings of the saints, Church teachings and my own personal ideas. I hope that it will serve as another tool to help you go deeper in your friendship with Christ and life of holiness.

NOURISHED IN SPIRIT

One of the primary responsibilities of a pastor is to direct God's people towards spiritual perfection. This takes place during the Sunday homily, confession and one to one teaching moments. But, few priests have the time, and few people can easily find the time for regular one-on-one spiritual direction. Therefore, I offer something new — a spiritual newsletter — "Nourished in Spirit." I plan to offer suggestions for you to take more seriously your spiritual life and friendship with Christ. I plan to offer both theoretical and practical advice.

I wish to begin our time together by reflecting on the title of our newsletter—*Nourished in Spirit*. I chose this title as a teaching tool. First, we must never forget that we must be nourished. God has created us to be incomplete, dependent, imperfect, and very needy. Look at an infant, without Mom and Dad, they can do virtually nothing. Energetic young adults still needs parents and friends. Adults need friendship and love. Even the aged need care. You will never be totally self-sufficient. Regardless of your wealth, status, job or power — you will always need things, need people, and need God. You need to be nourished.

Take a moment and reflect on this need for nourishment in the broadest sense of the term. What are your needs? How are they satisfied? What are those things – wants, desires, hopes, needs – that are not satisfied? How is this dissatisfaction a source of anxiety, fear, anger or anticipation? So much of our life is spent trying to satisfy our needs and to fill in the gaps. Do your pursuits in life bring the satisfaction you so much desire? How are you un-nourished, malnourished or undernourished? How are you empty and need to be filled? Is it time for a change?

When young St. Augustine reflected upon his life, he possessed lots of education, lots of money, lots of promiscuity, lots of power – and lots of emptiness. This realization helped move his heart to conversion in Christ. St. Augustine realized that even after so many of his physical needs were satisfied, he still had a sense of emptiness and dissatisfaction. He described this emptiness by saying, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, my God." After years of struggle, St. Augustine finally turned from the things of this world to the things of God. He surrendered to God. As he worked towards holiness of life, he began to know true satisfaction and wholeness. He learned that he had spiritual needs that only God could nourish. We are no different.

Haiti Update

Since July 1, 2020, St. Louis Parish has wired \$7,200 US to our sister parish in La Montagne, Haiti: Paroisse Notre Dame du Perpetuel Secours (Our Lady of



Perpetual Help Parish). Our material support has provided for many of this parish's needs, including increased COVID sanitation supplies, meals for school children, training for catechists, missals for the church, a Youth Retreat for Confirmandi, a photocopy machine, and a generator. The following is a letter of appreciation from the pastor:

Dear Pastor and St. Louis Parishioners:

I hope that you are well by the grace of God. I thank you so much for your help. Without your help, our parish life would be very difficult. Because of your help, the life of parishioners is improved. Many of our children are able to attend school and receive food 2-3 times a week. We have many children receiving the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation. Your assistance helps us support 6 chapels and the main church. I thank God for the good relationship that exists between us.

Please continue to pray for Haiti. The coronavirus has been very bad for us, and caused a lot of death. There is not a good hospital in our area, but we are grateful for the support you provide to the Medical Mission that serves us. They have saved a lot of people, and they are very important to La Montagne and our parish. I always pray for you.
