**Happy Advent!** This is such a wonderful season in the Church. The Church encourages us to slow down and prepare for the coming of our Savior. The saints often speak of the three comings of Christ. First, we remember His coming at Christmas. This is such a cause of joy. I hope that we will be well prepared to celebrate Christ's first coming at Christmas.

Next, we contemplate Christ's coming here and now in our life. Jesus so much wants to be a part of your daily lives. He desires that you make room for Him through prayer, participation at Mass and through your holiness of life. This coming of Christ is marked with charity. This coming is truly a challenge and struggle. Allow our Lord to more and more be the master of your life. Give your time to Him by attending Sunday Mass, one of the daily Masses and our parish's times of Adoration. Also, allow Him to come into your life by choosing His way of love and peace by putting aside sinful habits. Make a good confession during this Holy Season of Advent. We have confessions on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4:00pm, and Saturdays at 3pm. Call me to make an appointment for confession. Later this month, I will offer extra times for confessions as listed below. Through a good confession we allow Christ here and now to come to us with His mercy and forgiveness.

This right vision helps us here and now to always choose the way of Christ. Advent challenges us to re-orient our lives. We have been made for heaven, not just this world. At the start of Advent, the Church reminds us to look beyond our day to day lives and remember the goal of Heaven. Advent challenges us to choose the goal of Heaven through living a life of holiness.

Advent calls us to open our heart to the three-fold coming of Christ: at Christmas, now in our lives, and at His second coming. May we embrace Him now so that we will be ready to join Him in the glory of Heaven. May we have a good and holy Advent and truly prepare the way of the Lord. Come Lord Jesus! Come into our lives.

The Purgative Way: Introduction Continued

Beginners have a certain desire for perfection or for progress, even if this desire be as yet feeble and imperfect. Thus, we exclude from the category of beginners those worldlings – all too numerous – alas! Whose highest purpose is to escape mortal sin, but who have no earnest desire of advancing further. As we have shown above, the desire for perfection is the first step on the way.

Beginners have, however, some attachment to deliberate venial sin and, therefore, they frequently fall. This distinguishes them from souls already advancing along the way of perfection, who although they may from time to time commit some willful venial sins, yet earnestly strive to avoid them. The existence of these attachments is due to the fact that their passions are not as yet subdued; hence, they yielded to temptations of sensuality, pride, vanity, anger, envy, jealousy, and uncharitableness in word and deed. How many persons called devout retain attachments of this kind, which cause them to commit deliberate, venial sins which expose them to fall from time to time into grievous faults!

Different Categories of Beginners:

There are different categories of beginners:

Innocents souls desiring to grow in the spiritual life – children, young men and young women who, not content with the mere avoidance of mortal sin, wish to do something more for God and want to become perfect. The number of these would be greater were priests active in arousing this desire for perfection in Sunday school, at the meetings of parish organizations.

#### THE LITURGICAL CORNER

Beginning today, the First Sunday of Advent, our parish bulletin introduces a new feature: <u>THE LITURGICAL CORNER</u>. Many of our parishioners who have a deep love for the Mass and other forms of worship and devotion in the Church have expressed a desire to learn more about their faith. For the next six months we will help spread the good news about the Church's life of worship by means of this new feature. These weekly articles were written by Fr. Dennis Carbonaro, a good friend of Msgr. Kruse.

Today begins the holy season of Advent. Just as the civil year has a starting date, January 1, so too does the liturgical, or Church, year. It begins with the season of Advent. From the perspective of our lives as Catholics, today is New Years Day for us! In this part of the country we are blessed to have the various natural seasons of Fall, Spring, Summer and Winter and the changes that go along with them. The Church year has its own rhythm as well. The mystery of God is so immense that it becomes necessary to focus for a few weeks at a time on a certain aspect of the life of Christ. Advent comes from a Latin word which means "coming." We all recognize one meaning of the Advent season as a preparation for the solemn feast of Christmas. But actually Advent has *two* aspects to it.

From the first Sunday of Advent until December 16, the Church is actually preparing for Christ's *second* coming in glory. We recall this at each Mass when we pray: We proclaim Your death O Lord, and profess Your resurrection, *until You come again* This is the more important aspect of Christmas, since Christ is not being born all over again. His first coming at Bethlehem happened so that we might be saved from our sins and join Him, the Father and the Holy Spirit when He comes again. This is why making a good confession during the Advent season is a truly excellent way of preparing for Christmas.

From December 17 through December 24 the Church then focuses on remembering His first coming to us as man. The nine days before Christmas may be considered as a novena, a special intense time of preparation to recall God's greatest gift to us: His only Son!




# **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**
