
A MESSAGE FROM FATHER HEPNER

Dear parishioners,

"You keep using that word. I do not think it means what you think it means." -Inigo Montoya

If you've been Catholic long enough, perhaps it seems strange words like "discipleship," and "evangelization" that seemed to be exclusive trademarks of our protestant brothers and sisters have crept into Catholic homilies, books, videos, and even papal teaching. There is even such thing now as the *New* Evangelization. What's that all about?!

Of course this "new" vocabulary is really an old vocabulary that we forgot we had and, like that cool looking gold humeral veil used for adoration, pulled out of a drawer one day and said, "This is great! Why did we stop using it?!" But to keep the from becoming buzzwords like "paradigm shift" and "synergy," I want to explore exactly what discipleship is with this illustration:



This is the "Discipleship Wheel," adapted by our friends at Evangelical Catholic from Rich Cleveland's book, The Catholic Topical Memory System. In the Jesus center is (represented by the Chi Ro symbol). Just like a monstrance, authentic discipleship puts Christ on display and makes

him the center of our lives. The essential methods of doing this are the same for every Christian, though the details differ according to our unique personalities, experiences, and callings.

The most intimate relationship with Jesus is by living out the **sacraments**. How often do you renew your baptismal vows or call on the Holy Spirit who is active in your soul because of confirmation? Have you been faithful to going to confession once a month? What about full, active, conscious participation in Mass? If you're married, do you rely on the grace of your marriage vows to be patient, loving, and humble with your spouse and children?

The vertical spokes of the wheel connect us to God. We've spoken a lot about **prayer** and reading **scripture**. The Thursday evening men's group and Friday morning women's group are both focused on Bible studies, and any baptized Catholic can start reading scripture and talking with friends about what God is saying to them. The steps of *Lectio Divina* are an excellent guide to conversation with Jesus. However we pray, it is essential to set aside personal time every day where we are exclusively focused on God, letting him love us and speaking to him honestly from the heart.

The horizontal spokes of the wheel connect us to others. "Whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen," (1 John 4:20). Christian **community** is essential. This used to come very easily, when people readily joined social organizations and Catholicism imbued daily life. Now it requires more effort. It can be scary to reach out to another person and ask if they want to grab a coffee or a beer and talk about their relationship with Jesus. No need to be weird or awkward about it, but you are called to be courageous, confident in the Holy Spirit, and trusting that others have a hunger for Christian community like you.

Now that other weird word, "evangelization." Don't worry, you don't need pamphlets, a black tie, or doorknocking lessons. All you need is a connection to Christ and a connection to other people. Just plug them together like Clark Griswold plugging in his Christmas lights, stand back, and see the glorious things God does. You can start during your prayer time by making a list of people close to you and asking where they seem to be in their relationship with Jesus and his Church. What are the next steps that you think God desires for them? And does he want you to take an active part in those next steps (inviting them to Mass, praying with them, building up friendship, talking to them about confession or having their children baptized)? Or does he just want you to intercede for them and stay out of the way?

Finally, what holds everything in is the out rim of obedience. God's will is manifest in the moral law, Church teaching, our state in life, inspirations in prayer, and the circumstances around us which are beyond our control. **Obedience** is not easy, and it is only possible in and through Jesus, *the* beloved, obedient Son. Remembering how blessed we are to be Catholics and children of the Father makes obedience into something joyful.

What parts of this wheel are going well for you? What do you need to work on? That would be a great conversation with Jesus in your next prayer time, and perhaps the synergy that comes from it will lead to a paradigm shift.
