PASTOR NOTE

Eucharistic Revival: Our parish has been participating in the National Eucharistic Revival. Earlier this month we enjoyed listening to some reflections by parishioners who discussed the Eucharistic Devotion of Daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, visits to our Blessed Sacrament Chapel, and the weekly Men's Holy Hour. I have been summarizing these devotions. I hope this will help you go deeper in your devotion to our Lord Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist.

Visits to the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. Our parish has a beautiful chapel off the main sanctuary of our church. This space is called the Mother's Chapel or the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. At Sunday Mass it is used as a space for young families. During the rest of the week, it is used for individuals to visit our Lord's Eucharistic presence in the tabernacle in this chapel. The door to this chapel is located near the outside Life Prayer Garden. It has a keypad where a code can be entered. Turning a knob unlocks the door. Once entered, the door can be relocked. This door code can be obtained from the parish office or simply ask me sometime. I am not inclined to directly publish this code. Entering the chapel is quite easy. Ask me to show you how to use the keypad. This code and unlocking the door allows for visits at any time of the day - even very late at night or very early in the morning. This is an opportunity for Eucharistic prayer at a time that is convenient for you. Come to the chapel anytime! Come alone or with your family. The chapel has various lights that can be turned on as chosen. There are a variety of places to sit or kneel – even very close to the tabernacle. There are beautiful Stations of the Cross. This chapel allows a time of quiet prayer. You can stay for a few minutes or for a long time. During the time of prayer, you can offer any prayers of your choosing. Various prayer books are available. The prayer chapel gives you a lot of freedom during your time of prayer. I encourage you to find some time during the week to make a visit to the prayer chapel. Add a moment of prayer to your weekly errands. Find a specific time each day for your Chapel prayer time. Stop by when there is a particular burden or challenge in your life. Give it to our Lord. Jesus is there in the Chapel ready to give you abundant graces.

Memorial Day: This weekend we recall the many men and women who gave their lives for our nation and for our freedom. I encourage you to offer a word of thanks and prayer for them. Please join us for Mass on Monday, 7am.

First Friday Devotions: Traditionally, the Church has designated First Friday's for devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Usually, this includes attending Mass and reciting the Litany of the Sacred Heart. Many graces are connected to this devotion. Additionally, the month of June is devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. So, this Friday, June 2nd is a double day of grace as being the First Friday of June. I encourage you to come to the 7am Mass and participate in our First Friday devotions. God has for us then the tenderness and devotedness of a father. He gave us His only Son. He gives Himself wholly, and from now on, in a permanent manner to His children by dwelling in their hearts. He lives in us as a most loving and most devoted father.

He gives Himself also as a friend. Friendship adds to the relations between father and son. It adds a kind of familiarity, a reciprocity whence flows the sweetest interaction. At the Last Supper, Jesus declared I no longer call you slaves, but friends. As a friend He acts as our most powerful ally, our most efficient helper.

This divine Helper is at the same time our Sanctifier. Coming to live in our soul He transforms it into a sacred temple enriched with all manner of virtues. Our soul, therefore, is made the temple of the Living God, a sanctuary reserved to the Most High, a Holy of Holies, a throne of mercy where He is pleased to be lavish with His heavenly favors and which He enriches with every virtue.

The Most Adorable Trinity living and acting within us must, indeed, be the principle of our sanctification, the source of our interior life.

Possessing such a great treasure as the Most Holy Trinity we ought to make it the object of frequent meditation – "to walk inwardly with God." Such a thought awakes in us chiefly three sentiments: adoration, love and imitation.




