This inconvenience is a good motivation to pray for an increase in priestly vocations.

Eucharistic Revival: As you know our Diocese has been participating in a national Eucharistic Revival. Over the last few weeks, we have enjoyed hearing some reflections from parishioners. I invited them to reflect on different Eucharistic devotions. I thank these parishioners for offering reflections: Tim Taylor, Rita Tracey, Bethany Brigham, Rachel Bystry, Cynthia Tracy, Bridgette Castelein, Steve Harmon and Jeff Peacock. They all offered a wonderful reflection. I am especially grateful considering that public speaking is not very easy. I hope that their reflection inspired you to embrace deeper Eucharistic devotion.

I asked our speakers to reflect upon one of four areas of Eucharistic devotion: Daily Mass, Holy Hours, Chapel Visits, and the Men's Holy Hour. Only a few people heard all of these reflections. So, over the next few weeks I will summarize these devotions. I hope this will help you go deeper in your devotion to our Lord Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist.

The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from *The Spiritual Life* by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

Role of God in Christian Life:

God acts in us either directly, by Himself, or through the Incarnate Word [Jesus], or through the mediation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Angels, and the saints.

The first cause of the supernatural life is the Blessed Trinity, or by appropriation, the Holy Spirit. True, the life of grace is a work common to the Three Divine Persons, for it is a work outside of Himself, yet, because it is a work of love, it is attributed especially to the Holy Spirit. The Most Adorable Trinity contributes to our sanctification in two ways: the Three Divine Persons come to dwell in our souls; there they create a supernatural organism which transforms and elevates them thus enabling them to perform Godlike acts.

Since the Christian life is a participation in God's own life, it is evident that none but God Himself can confer it upon us. This He does by coming to dwell in our souls and by giving Himself wholly to us in order that we may first of all render Him our homage, enjoy His presence and allow ourselves to be led with docility to the practice of Christ's virtues and into the dispositions of His holy soul.

God is in all creatures in a threefold manner: by His power, inasmuch as all creatures are subject to His dominion; by His presence, because He sees all, even the most secret thoughts of the soul; by His essence, since He acts everywhere and since every where He is the plenitude of being itself and the fist cause of whatever is real in creation, giving continually to creatures not only life and movement, but their very being.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, "I will not leave you orphans." God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.

We had another very successful opening last Saturday May 6th. **We served 71 families!** We gave out 9 laundry soaps, 885 diapers and 54 packs of wipes, 31 pairs of socks, 188 clothing items, 15 sets of baby bottles, 2 high chairs, and 2 car seats plus much much more!



Items needed for the next distribution on June 3rd are: summer clothes (sizes Newborn-4T), shorts (sizes Newborn-4T), baby sun block, baby sun hats/bucket hats, baby laundry soap, dish soap, new baby books (up to age 4), wipes & diapers (sizes 4, 5, and 6), baby bottles, powdered baby formula, car booster seats, baby/toddler tooth brushes, sippy cups and toddler utensils. We are also in need of gently used boys clothes (sizes 12mo-4T) and gently used maternity clothes.

St. Louis Respect Life Committee BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN 'Change for Life'



All funds raised will be given to support the pro-life efforts of Abigail's Women's Clinic in Mendota. The Magi Baby Chest and Abigail Women's Center provide different kinds of support to pregnant women in need, so we highly encourage parishioners to prayerfully consider supporting both! The clinic provides pregnancy services and referrals to women who are in a crisis pregnancy, or in a financial crisis that puts their unborn child at risk. They provide ultrasounds and statistics show that once a mother sees an ultrasound of her unborn child, she is 90% more likely to continue her pregnancy.

Baby bottles will be available at the Church entrances beginning on Mother's Day, May 14th, for individuals or families to take home, fill with change (or cash/checks) and return to the church on Father's Day, June 18th.
