#### A MESSAGE FROM MSGR. KRUSE

Wednesday, August 25<sup>th</sup> will be an historic day for our parish. It is the feast day of St. Louis and so it is the feast day of our parish. We are the only parish in the Diocese named after St. Louis. Traditionally, a parish's patronal feast day is a time of celebration and special worship. This year our parish has a wonderful celebration planned. I am grateful to Fr. Hepner and the many volunteers who have been working to plan this great event.

This year's feast day is historic because Coadjutor Bishop Louis Tylka will visit our parish. August 25<sup>th</sup> is his name's day and patron saint day. When I saw him recently, he expressed his excitement to visit the parish of St. Louis, on the actual feast day of his patron saint. It is a nice blessing for him and our parish.

Our celebration begins at 5:15pm with a Solemn Mass. It is a tremendous blessing to participate in a Mass celebrated by a bishop. Bishops are the successors of the apostles. A bishop possesses the fullness of Christ's priesthood. Therefore, a Mass celebrated by a bishop is the fullest expression of the mysteries of the Mass. It always brings special blessings, grace, and participation in the fullness of the Church's worship. I encourage you to make every effort to join us in this special Mass. There will be beautiful music and Bishop Tylka is a great homilist!

After Mass, we will enjoy a wonderful dinner in Hark-rader Hall beginning about 6:15pm. If you cannot join us for Mass, please come to the dinner. This will be a wonderful moment for our parish family to join together for a wonderful celebration. And, we join with the head of our family – our Bishop. It will give you a chance to meet our new Bishop and even take a few pictures with him. The Bishop's visit to a parish is a rare moment due to his tending to over 120 parishes across the 26 counties of the Diocese.

Bishop Tylka is a very personable man and very approachable. Some ask me the proper way to address a bishop. The most formal way is to address him as Your Excellency. Less formal, Bishop or Bishop Tylka. But, he really prefers Bishop Lou. As Coadjutor Bishop, he will become our Diocesan Bishop when Bishop Jenky retires next year. Our celebration gives us a chance to pray for him.

I truly hope that you will not miss this historic opportunity to spend time with our Bishop on our parish Feast Day.

#### NOURISHED IN SPIRIT BY MSGR. KRUSE

These descriptions about sin may need some time for reflection and understanding. But, all of us know what sin is all about. We have all sinned and have felt its emptiness. We know that sense of feeling distorted or dis-integrated – feeling like the pieces of life are not fitting together. All of us have felt like hiding because of our shameful sin. Sin is a presence in our life and this world. Understanding sin, its consequences and its roots are an important factor in our pursuit of spiritual excellence. Spiritual perfection will require seeing and acknowledging sin in our life; meeting it with God's forgiving grace; and, learning to live without sin. In the future, we will explore these topics. But for now, I paraphrase an allegory from the ancient Greek philosopher Plato:

Imagine there was a cave. Deep inside, there was a huge room with a big empty wall. Lots of people were sitting in the room and facing the wall. Their heads, hands and feet were bound in such a way that they could only face forward. Behind them was a big fire that illuminated the giant wall. On the wall were beautifully pleasurable images that danced about and en- tertained the people. The people did not know that these dancing images were actually shadows. These shadows came from puppets that were moving in front of the giant fire. The fire cast the puppets' shadows on the wall. The people did not know that were looking at shadows.

Then suddenly one day, a man mysteriously broke free from his chains. He turned around. He saw the puppeteers and the giant fire. He saw how the pleasing images were mere shadows. He realized that he was in a great cave and began to run towards the entrance. Some of the puppeteers tried to stop him. But, he broke free of them. He ran past the great fire and out of the cave. Outside of the cave, at first, he was blinded by the sun. Soon he adjusted to the brightness and beheld the true beauty and true reality of created things. Until then, his life consisted of darkness, shadows, lies, bondage, and passing pleasure. Now, he saw the real beauty of what is really real. He escaped the cave!

In many ways, our sinful world leaves us in a cave where we look at a shadow world of passing pleasure. Most of us are chained and do not know it. Sin binds us to an illusion of security and pleasure.


