### Growing Disciples: A Note from Bishop Tylka:

Growing Disciples is a multivear pastoral planning process for the Catholic Diocese of Peoria to renew discipleship and enhance relationships with Jesus Christ in every corner of our region. The Bishop will be examining the current structure of parishes in the diocese to evaluate how they can best meet the needs of the faithful and address challenges facing the Church today. Why are we doing this as a Diocese? We are Growing Disciples. Bishop Tylka chose that title intentionally. The world is different and we have to find new ways of doing things. We have fewer priests. Fewer Catholics. Fewer children. People are moving. We have to reimagine the way we reach people with the Good News.

The Growing Disciples process is designed to provoke conversation, to gather data and receive feedback. Based on the feedback from recent priest meetings, the Diocese is changing the way they release the second draft models. You will be able to see your parish's second draft model with appropriate context and information, online by October 1 at cdop.org That way, all parishioners have access to all the information at the same time, and can come prepared to their parish meeting. Your input is needed and valued as Bishop Tylka discerns the future footprint of the Diocese of Peoria.

### The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from The Spiritual Life by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

Interior Means of Perfection: Conformity to the Divine Will

The knowledge of God not only unites our mind to that of God, but is also leads to love because all in God is loveable. By showing us the need we have of God, the knowledge of self makes us ardently long for Him and throws us into His arms. Conformity to the divine will, however, unites us even more intimately and directly to Him who is the source of all perfection. In fact, it subordinates and unites our will to God, thus placing our ruling faculty at the service of the Sovereign Master. It may be said that our degree of perfection corresponds to the extent to which we conform to the will of God.

By conforming to the divine will we understand the absolute and loving submission of our will to that of God. Conforming to God's will means doing God's will and submitting to God's will. Doing His will incorporates fulfilling His commandments and counsels. Submitting to His will incorporates accepting all providential event willed or allowed by God for our own greater good and chiefly for our sanctification.

God, being Sovereign Lord, has the right to give us commands. Since He is infinitely good, He commands nothing that is not conducive at once to His glory and our own happiness. We must, then, willingly and unquestioningly submit ourselves to His laws: the natural law, the positive divine law, ecclesiastical laws, or a just civil law. The closer to adhering to His law, the closer is our approach to God. Sanctification is impossible without the observation of the commandments.

Submission to God's will includes submitting ourselves to God in all the events of life, happy or unhappy – even suffering. Submitting to God's will unites our entire self to God. Through submission we obtain all the virtues and perfections of God.
