Growing Disciples Program: I am very grateful for everyone who attended our parish meeting last Thursday night. We learned many things about the Bishop's plans for evangelization which includes a streamlining of our parishes, churches and resources. At this meeting, I presented the Second Round of Parish Models. We are invited to offer feedback and comments to the Bishop. In May 2024 he will issue his final decision on new parish groupings which includes parish mergers. Then we enter an implementation phase to carry out his decision.


At the meeting, I announced the Second Round Parish Model involving St. Louis parish. This proposal is a merging of the following four parishes into one parish: St. Louis, Princeton, St. John, Walnut; Immaculate Conception, Ohio; and St. Mary, Tiskilwa. The proposal designates St. Louis church as the primary site of worship. This means that it will provide the entire array of liturgical activities for the merged parish. St. John church will be a secondary site of worship. This means that it will provide the entire array of liturgical activities for the merged parish. St. John church will be a secondary site of worship. This means that it will provide a limited amount of liturgical activity. The churches of Immaculate Conception and St. Mary are proposed to be closed. This is a summary of the proposal. Of course, more details were presented at the parish meeting. At the meeting I presented some data sheets regarding this proposal. These are available on a table near Harkrader Hall. Please feel free to pick them up.

At this time, we have the opportunity to submit feedback to the Bishop regarding this proposal. If you wish to offer feedback, please pick up a sheet near the hall. Rosary Rally: The organization, America Needs Fatima, promotes devotion to Mary as a means to bring God's blessings upon our nation. On Saturday, October 14th at 10am, at Veteran's Park, you are invited to join a public recitation of the Rosary to benefit our nation.

Embraced by Hope Memorial Mass: On Monday Oct. 16th at 6:00 PM, Mass will be offered for our children who have gone before us in death, to pray with those families who have suffered the cross of infertility, to pray for those desiring to conceive or adopt, and to pray for those mothers/families who are pregnant and for their child whom they await. At this Mass all of the Roses with their remembrances and prayer requests will be placed near the sanctuary so that our children will be remembered, and prayers offered. At this Mass Msgr. Kruse will bless the Embraced by Hope Crosses. Msgr. Kruse will invite those who have suffered the loss of a child, those who have carried or are carrying the cross of infertility, those grandparents who have lost a grandchild, and those who are expecting a baby, to come forward at that time to receive an Embraced by Hope Cross. The crosses will be given out in silence and without expressing the exact reason for one receiving a cross. If preferring greater privacy, one may receive a cross by picking one up after Mass or requesting one from Msgr. Kruse or Susanna Prushinski. If you are unable to attend Mass on Monday Oct. 16th, but



would like to receive your memorial cross, please contact us and we will make sure you receive one. We invite everyone to attend this Mass. May our prayers be joined together, placed in the hands of our Blessed Mother and then be offered to Jesus.

Harkrader Hall Air Conditioner Replacement: The two AC units are original to the parish hall. Over the summer, the AC units required some repairs. I have been advised that the units are on their last leg. They also use outdated and expensive freon. I have decided to replace the two units at a cost of \$48,000. This is an unforeseen expense and is outside our usual operational budget. I kindly ask, if possible, for you to assist in defraying these costs. I invite you to make a donation towards replacing the AC units. You can place a donation in an envelope marked "AC Repair." You may place it in the Sunday collection or bring it to the parish office. Interior Means of Perfection: Prayer

Prayer embodies and completes all of the other means of perfection. Prayer is itself a desire for perfection, since no one would sincerely pray who did not wish to become better. It presupposes some knowledge of God and of self, since it establishes relations between the two. It conforms our will to that of God, since any good prayer contains, explicitly or implicitly, an act of submission to Our Sovereign Master. Prayer, moreover, perfects all these acts, by bringing us in all humility before the Majesty of God, in order to adore Him, and implore new graces that will enable us to grow in perfection.

Traditionally, the saints offer three definitions of prayer: 1) prayer is an elevation of the soul to God like an affectionate quest for God; 2) prayer is the asking of things from God; 3) prayer is a familiar conversation with God. Drawing these together, prayer may be defined as an elevation of our soul to God to offer Him our homage and ask His favors, in order to grow in holiness for His glory.

There are fundamentally two types of prayer. First, prayer is worship of God which includes 1) adoration, which acknowledges God's supreme dominion and our absolute dependence; 2) thanksgiving, where we express our gratitude for His many gifts; 3) reparation, which expresses our sorrow for sin and offense. Second, prayer is petition offered to God where we ask things of God and seek His assistance.

Prayer has sanctifying power which leads to our perfection. Prayer produces three marvelous effects: it detaches us from creatures; it unites us to God; and, it gradually transforms us into God.
