PASTOR NOTE

Monday, June 19th, is our special parish Day of Eucharistic Adoration. Our parish will host the Diocesan Eucharistic Revival Traveling Monstrance. The church will be open all day. Stop by for a moment of prayer. Join us for a special Holy Hour from 6:30pm to 7:30pm.

Cenacle Prayer Groups: Our parish has been participating in the National Eucharistic Revival. We are invited to go deeper in our friendship with Jesus through embracing a deeper understanding of the Eucharist and offering devotion to Him. Our parish offers many opportunities for Eucharistic devotion: Sunday Mass, daily Mass, Holy Hours, and visits to our Eucharistic Chapel. Last week I announced a new opportunity to grow in devotion to our Eucharistic Lord called Cenacle Prayer Groups.

The name of our new prayer groups draws from the rich meaning of "Cenacle." The cenacle was the Upper Room which was mentioned many times in the Gospel. It was a small intimate place where Jesus and the Apostles regularly interacted. Many great events happened in the cenacle. The Last Supper took place in the cenacle. Here, Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist. After His resurrection, Jesus regularly appeared to the Apostles in the cenacle. On Pentecost, in the cenacle the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples while they were gathered in prayer. In the cenacle the Apostles met our Lord Jesus and He gave them great gifts.

The Cenacle Prayer Groups seek to imitate the Apostles. The groups will meet in the intimate space of our parish Eucharistic Chapel. Group members will pray before our Eucharistic Lord present in the chapel's tabernacle. The Cenacle Prayer Groups will meet at a specific day and time each week for about one hour. Each group will follow a routine of prayer that I will provide. This routine of prayer will provide a general structure of prayer that will be common for all of the groups while also allowing for individual flexibility. This routine will include some prayers offered in common by the entire group. There will also be common prayers recited privately by each member. There will be time for private meditation. Members will pray for each other and the wider parish. During the group holy hour there will **not** be group discussion or scripture reflection. The overall purpose of the Cenacle Small Group is to provide an opportunity for each individual to enjoy a time of prayer with others so that each member will grow closer to our Savior Jesus.

Cenacle Prayer Groups are small groups of parishioners. People of any age may join a group. Non-parishioners may also join a group. There will be as many Cenacle Prayer Groups as needed. Each group will meet at the same specific time and day each week. They will meet for about one hour each week. The meeting time can be at any time of the week, except during usual parish events such as adoration and Mass. Multiple groups will not meet at the same time. The Parish Office will coordinate the schedule of Cenacle Prayer Groups.

Each Cenacle Prayer Group may have a different size of members. Cenacle Prayer Groups will work best if they are not too small nor too large. Cenacle Prayer Groups will form in one of two ways. First, parishioners may form their own Cenacle Prayer Group. This may be composed of an individual family or be composed of a group of friends. Once this group forms, they must choose a leader. This leader emails Msgr. Kruse (jameskruse1996@gmail.com) providing the leader's name, members' names, and three proposed times for their group's meeting. The Office will then assign the day and time.

The second way of forming a group involves individuals or couples. They may email Msgr. Kruse requesting to be assigned to a group and propose three times. The Office will then assign these individuals to a group and time.

Once the groups form and times are assigned, the groups may begin meeting. The group prayer books will be provided. Even while groups are meeting in the chapel, individuals may visit the chapel for private prayers.

I encourage you to consider joining together in a Cenacle Prayer Group. I am confident that it will be of great benefit for you and the entire parish. Our Lord deeply desires to grow in friendship with you. This requires spending time with Him. The commitment to a Cenacle Prayer Group facilitates a weekly encounter with Jesus. I pray that you will step out in faith and join a group.

The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from *The Spiritual Life* by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

The Role of Jesus in the Christian Life:

Jesus is the head of regenerated humanity, just as Adam was the head of the human race; but, in a far more perfect manner. By His merits Christ regained for us our rights to grace and glory, and by His example He shows us how we are to live in order to sanctify ourselves and merit heaven. He is the head of a mystical body of which we are the members. Thus, He is the meritorious, exemplary, and vital cause of our sanctification.

Because of the exceeding great charity wherewith He loved us, by His holy passion on the cross, He merited for us justification and made satisfaction for us. All the free acts of our Savior were at once satisfactory and meritorious; all had an infinite moral value. Christ obtains for us the full pardon of our sins and remission of the temporal punishment due to them. Christ likewise merited for us all the grace we need to attain our supernatural end and to develop in us the supernatural life. He merited all things for us. He has given us the power of satisfying and meriting, thus making us the secondary causes, the agents of our own sanctification. He has made this co-operation in a law and an essential condition of our spiritual life. We must carry our cross.

Jesus willed to be the exemplary cause, the model of our supernatural life. In order to develop a life that is a participation in the life of God, we must strive as far as it possible, to live a divine life. Hence, we needed a divine model. The eternal Son of God, His living image, became man and showed us by His example how man could here on earth approach the perfections of God. He presents to us a practical imitation of the divine perfections. Jesus is the perfect model. All people can imitate Him. His model attracts all people.



month - 4T), and gently used maternity clothes (all sizes).


