PASTOR NOTE

During these days of Easter our hearts are filled with such joy as we contemplate our Lord's Resurrection. On this Sunday after Easter, we focus our contemplation on the mystery of Christ's Divine Mercy. We rejoice in His forgiveness and love that He has offered to us. Devotion to the Divine Mercy of Jesus has always been part of the Church's life, but only in the last twenty years has it been a universal and annual feast in the Church. Our parish has embraced an annual parish celebration of the Divine Mercy. Once again this year we will begin in the Church at 2:30pm for a time of Eucharistic Adoration, recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet and enjoy Benediction. Then, we will enjoy a dinner from Los Ranchitos. The children then enjoy activities and the adults are welcome to stay in Harkrader Hall and socialize. I encourage you to come out to our parish Divine Mercy Sunday parish event.

Part of celebrating Christ's Divine Mercy is to acknowledge the many gifts that He has given to us. His generosity is a function of His Divine Mercy. She brings many gifts and talents to the Magi Baby Chest. Ashley will work closely with Jessica and me to carry out all of the tasks for the Magi Baby Chest. With her added help we can now advance the marketing of the Magi Baby Chest and reach out to the wider community, especially to secure donations. I am excited to have Ashley join our wonderful parish staff.

I ask you to continue to help spread the word about the Magi Baby Chest. Please take some flyers near the church doors and hand them out. Mention the outreach to your family and friends. Post the information on our face book page. We are ready and prepared for the Magi Baby Chest to grow even more and provide baby and toddler supplies to families. The Spiritual Life: Excerpt from The Spiritual Life by Adolphe Tanquerey, Desclee and Co., Belgium, 1951.

The Natural Life of Man:

Man [each person] is a mysterious compound of body and soul. In him spirit and matter closely unite to form but one nature and one person. Man is, so to speak, the nexus, the point of contact between spiritual and bodily substances – the abstract of all the marvels of creation. He is a little world gathered in itself all other worlds, a microcosm, showing forth the wisdom of God who united in this fashion two things so far apart.

This little world is full of life: according to St. Gregory, one finds three sorts of life, vegetative, animal and intellectual. Like plants man takes food, grows, and reproduces himself. Like animals, he is aware of sensible objects, towards which he is drawn by sensitive appetite, emotions and passions, and like animals he moves spontaneously from within. Like angels, though in a different manner and in a lesser degree, he knows intellectually suprasensible being and truth, while his will is freely drawn towards rational good.

These three kinds of life are not superimposed one on the other, but they blend and arrange themselves in due relation in order to converge towards the same end – due relation in order to converge towards the same end – the perfection of the whole man. It is both a rational and a biological law that is a composite being life cannot subsist and develop save on condition of harmonizing and bringing its various elements under the control of the highest of them. In man, then, the lower faculties, vegetative and sensitive, must needs be subject to reason and will. This condition is essential. Whenever it fails, life languishes and vanishes.
