Gettysburg Address: Abraham Lincoln

Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth, upon this continent, a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that "all men are created equal"

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived, and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of it, as a final resting place for those who died here, that the nation might live. This we may, in all propriety do. But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate -- we cannot consecrate -- we cannot hallow, this ground -- The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have hallowed it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here; while it can never forget what they did here. It is rather for us, the living, we here be dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that, from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they here, gave the last full measure of devotion -that we here highly resolve these dead shall not have died in vain: that the nation, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.

NOURISHED IN SPIRIT BY MSGR. KRUSE

God has created us as a union of body and soul, material and spirit. Both need to be nourished. All of us know about physical growth and maturity. All of us know ways to satisfy physical needs. But, so many of us neglect our spiritual growth – our spiritual needs. There are so many adults who are physically mature, economically mature, and emotionally mature; but, they are spiritual children or spiritual adolescents. In a sense, they have become spiritually retarded. Their spiritual growth has been neglected.

So, by this newsletter and its advice, I wish to offer you nourishment for your spirit. I give you food for your soul. I wish to awaken within you a greater sense of spiritual realities and assist your spirit to grow to maturity. The saints call this the road to spiritual perfection. But, just as human growth is a slow and nearly imperceptible process, so too, is our spiritual growth. As we take our faith and practice more seriously, we may not notice immediate results. But, let us trust that if we give God time and commitment, He will do great things for us. He will give us all the nourishment we need to join Him in heaven.

In weeks to come we will learn more about our spiritual side and ways for it to be nourished. Ultimately, we'll see that real spiritual nourishment comes through Christ's final gift to us – another Advocate – the Holy Spirit. Only through Him will we truly be Nourished in Spirit.

God has created you as a body-soul unity. Both need to be nourished. Before we can really grow towards spiritual perfection, we must have a good sense of who we are – here and now. One of the first steps to growth and change is to clearly see who we are. In these next few letters I would like you to pretend that you are standing in front of a mirror. Take a really good look at yourself and your life. Say a prayer with me, "Lord Jesus, help me see myself the way that you see me." Holiness includes perceiving reality as God sees it. This includes seeing yourself from God's perspective.

So, as you look into the mirror, what is the first thing that you see? Your body! When God created you, he gave you your body. This is a simple fact that can never be forgotten as we pursue spiritual holiness. You are bodily.
